Results are based on telephone interviews conducted January 6-10, 2016 with a sample of national adults, aged 18+, living in all 50 U.S. states and the District of Columbia. For this poll, the margin of sampling error is plus or minus 4 percentage points at the 95% confidence level.

Interviews are conducted with respondents on landline telephones and cell phones, with interviews conducted in Spanish for respondents who are Spanish-speaking. The sample of national adults includes a minimum quota of 60% cell phone respondents, with additional minimum quotas by region. Landline and cell phone respondents are selected using random digit dial methods. Landline respondents are chosen at random within each household on the basis of which member had the most recent birthday.
